Our marinas are conveniently located in close proximity to world-class marine service centres.

The premier home for superyachts in the South Pacific. Centrally located on the southern side of Auckland's Waitematā Harbour, Silo Marina is on the doorstep of the Hauraki Gulf's stunning cruising grounds and provides a convenient base for Pacific cruising.

Silo Marina can accommodate vessels up to 140 metres in length.



A boutique inner-city marina catering for superyachts, family cruising catamarans, and power vessels for both short-term and long-term stays. Positioned in a vibrant entertainment and commercial precinct, Auckland Central Marina offers a comprehensive marine service package just a short walk away from the city's bars, restaurants, top hotels, shops and transport links.

Auckland Central Marina can accommodate vessels up to 55 metres in length.



Just a short walk from Tāmaki Makaurau Auckland's city centre, Westhaven Marina embodies the city's rich maritime heritage. Once a bustling hub for heavy industry, shipbuilding and servicing, it has evolved into the largest recreational marina in the Southern Hemisphere.

Climate

Auckland has a **temperate maritime climate**, meaning mild temperatures year-round, with moderate rainfall and relatively high humidity.

SEASONAL OVERVIEW



Summer (December – February)

20-26°C (68-79°F) — warm and humid with lots of sunshine; occasional showers and thunderstorms



Autumn (March – May)

16-23°C (61-73°F) — mild and gradually cooling; rainfall increases slightly



Winter (June – August)

8-15°C (46-59°F) — cool and wet, but not freezing; frequent rain, overcast days, and southwest winds



Spring (September – November)

12-20°C (54-68°F) — warming up; variable conditions with a mix of sun, showers, and wind

With mild temperatures and plenty of sunshine, Auckland is a year-round cruising destination.

CENTRAL AND INNER-CITY PRECINCTS

- **Wynyard Quarter:** Harbourside dining with fresh seafood, cocktails, and stunning views.
- **Britomart and Commercial Bay:** A hub for modern eateries, rooftop bars, and international flavours.
- **Karangahape Road (K' Road):** A creative precinct full of eclectic eats, dive bars, cocktail lounges, and late-night energy.
- **Ponsonby:** A vibrant strip of bars, restaurants, and hidden laneway gems.
- **Parnell and Newmarket:** From fine dining to cosy cafés, these leafy suburbs mix heritage charm with culinary flair.
- **Kingsland:** Laid-back pubs, indie eateries, and lively spots popular with pre-Eden Park crowds and late-night revellers.

WIDER AUCKLAND FAVOURITES

- **West Auckland:** Family-run vineyards and winery restaurants set among the Waitākere foothills.
- **Devonport:** A seaside village with cafés, wine bars, and relaxed restaurants just a short boat ride away.
- **Takapuna:** Beachside brunch spots, casual bars, and diverse global cuisine.
- **Mission Bay:** Beachfront dining with casual eateries, ice cream spots, and laid-back bars overlooking the harbour.
- **Matakana Village:** A foodie destination with weekend markets, boutique vineyards, and artisanal producers.
- **Waiheke Island:** World-class vineyards, beachfront bistros, and long-lunch favourites in a picture-perfect setting.

Shopping highlights

- **Commercial Bay:** Located on Auckland's waterfront, Commercial Bay combines shopping, dining, and modern city energy in one vibrant precinct. Explore over 60 fashion and lifestyle stores alongside more than 40 food and beverage offerings — from casual bites to high-end restaurants and lively bars, all just a short distance from our marinas.
- **Ponsonby:** Boutique shopping, homewares, and artisan food vendors along a stylish strip.
- **Westfield Newmarket:** Designer brands, rooftop cinema, and a great food court.
- **Sylvia Park (Mt Wellington):** Auckland's largest mall.
- **Matakana Farmers Market (Saturdays):** Local produce, NZ artisan goods, vintage finds.
- **Takapuna:** A mix of fashion, gifts, and beachside boutiques — all just steps from the sand.



Walks and outdoor highlights

- **Long Bay Regional Park:** Coastal tracks and picnic spots with sea views.
- **Wenderholm Regional Park:** Forest trails, river kayaking, and a peaceful beach.
- **Tāwharanui Regional Park:** Hidden coves, white-sand beaches, native wildlife.
- **Pākiri Beach:** Remote, unspoiled white-sand beach with surf, space, and epic sunrises.
- **Ōmanawanui Track (Waitākere Ranges):** Coastal track through native bush and cliff-top paths — panoramic views.
- **Kitekite Falls (Piha):** Three-tier waterfall with a swimming hole at the base — a lush, family-friendly bush walk.
- **Mercer Bay Loop (near Piha):** Dramatic cliffs, wild coastline — especially stunning at sunset.
- **Fairy Falls Track (Waitākere Ranges):** Ferns, waterfalls, and peaceful bush trail.
- **Piha Beach to Karekare Track:** Black sand beaches, cliffs, and cinematic views made famous by New Zealand film, The Piano.
- **Te Henga Walkway:** Wild, rugged coast — a rewarding hike.



Event highlights

Each year, Auckland hosts a range of iconic marine, cultural, and lifestyle events that draw global attention and offer memorable experiences for crew and guests alike. While many events are annual, others take place every two or three years, making them especially anticipated when they return. Event timings are indicative only and may be subject to change.

- **Auckland Anniversary Weekend Regatta** (January)
One of the world's largest single-day regattas, featuring classic yachts, waka, and powerboats racing on the Waitematā Harbour.
- **Bay of Islands Sailing Week** (January)
One of the Southern Hemisphere's largest regattas. Attracts a huge mix of boats and professional crews.
- **New Zealand Millennium Cup** (January/February)
NZ's superyacht regatta, previously held in the Bay of Islands. Showcases luxury vessels in a competitive setting.
- **SailGP Auckland** (January/February)
Watch world-class foiling catamarans race at exhilarating speeds on the Waitematā Harbour.
- **Harbour Classic** (February/March)
An annual celebration of Auckland's sailing culture with a social and inclusive race on the harbour.
- **The Ocean Race — formerly Volvo Round the World Race** — (early in the year)
Known as the world's toughest team sailing challenge, this iconic around-the-world offshore race is held every three to four years, returning to Auckland as a Southern Ocean stopover in March 2027.
- **Round the Bays Auckland** (March)
Held each March, this lively community event draws tens of thousands of participants to run, walk or wheel along Auckland's waterfront from the city centre to St Heliers Bay.
- **Moana Auckland: New Zealand's Ocean Festival** (February/March)
A celebration of Tāmaki Makaurau's deep connection with the ocean bringing together on and off water events, from sailing races to live performances and waterfront activities.
- **Auckland Wooden Boat Festival** (March)
Held in our very own harbour, this event showcases beautifully restored classic vessels and celebrates New Zealand's rich boatbuilding heritage.
- **Auckland Boat Show** (March)
New Zealand's biggest on-water boat show, featuring the latest marine innovation, luxury yachts, and marine services — right in the heart of Auckland Central Marina.
- **Matariki Festival** (June/July)
A mid-winter celebration of the Māori New Year with food, art, storytelling, and remembrance — marked with fireworks and public events around the city.
- **Sydney to Auckland Ocean Race** (October)
A trans-Tasman yacht race starting in Sydney Harbour, Australia, and finishing in Auckland, bringing together top offshore racing talent from both nations.
- **Coastal Classic Yacht Race** (Labour Weekend — October)
NZ's premier long-distance coastal race. Over 100 yachts race 119 nm from Auckland to Russell in the Bay of Islands — a spectacular start line from Devonport Wharf.
- **RNZYS Wednesday night series** (weekly, daylight savings months)
The Royal New Zealand Yacht Squadron hosts casual midweek racing open to many types of boats — a great social sailing event.

More events take place throughout the year — ask our team about events taking place during your stay.


North Island *highlights*

The North Island of New Zealand blends vibrant cities with natural wonders like geothermal springs, volcanic peaks, lush coastal forests, and rich Māori heritage. Warmer than the South, it offers a diverse mix of urban culture, outdoor adventure, and spiritual significance.

TOP THINGS TO DO

Cape Reinga

The northern most tip of NZ where the Tasman Sea and Pacific Ocean meet – a sacred place in Māori tradition



Bay of Islands

Cruise among 140 subtropical islands, spot dolphins, and visit historic spots like Russell and the Waitangi Treaty Grounds tradition



Coromandel Peninsula

Dig your own hot pool at Hot Water Beach or walk the coastal track to Cathedral Cove

Matamata

Hobbiton Movie Set: Step into the lush pastures of the Shire with a guided tour of the iconic movie set from The Lord of the Rings and The Hobbit movie sets, the Green Dragon Inn, and experience a cinematic slice of Middle-earth

Auckland

Climb the Sky Tower, explore the museums, or cruise the harbour to nearby islands like Waiheke

Waitomo Caves

Float beneath glowing ceilings of bioluminescent glowworms or go black-water rafting through limestone caverns



Mount Taranaki

Hike or photograph this near-perfect volcanic cone, often compared to Japan's Mount Fuji

Rotorua

Soak in natural hot springs, watch erupting geysers, and experience Māori performances and hāngi feasts

Lake Taupo

Go trout fishing, cruise the lake, or unwind in lakeside geothermal pools

Tongariro Alpine Crossing

World-famous day hike, with volcanic craters, emerald lakes, and panoramic views



Wellington

Ride the historic cable car, visit Te Papa Museum, and discover the city's film, arts, and coffee scene

South Island *highlights*

The South Island is a paradise of rugged mountains, pristine fiords, and tranquil lakes. From the iconic fiords of Milford Sound to the alpine vistas of Aoraki/Mount Cook, it's a land of dramatic beauty and remote wilderness, perfect for hiking, wildlife spotting, and unforgettable scenic journeys.


Marlborough Wine Region

Tour world-renowned Sauvignon Blanc vineyards and cellar doors




Abel Tasman National Park
